# **Directions to Konza Prairie Biological Station**

From Ackert Hall: Go south on Denison

Turn east onto **Bluemont**Turn south onto **Tuttle Creek** 

Take the 177 exit

Immediately after crossing the Kansas River bridge, turn right onto McDowell Creek Rd.

Proceed about 6 miles Turn left at **Konza sign**
