3) Teams will need to register as a group prior the start of the HerpDrive.

4) Teams must remain together, individuals competing on a team may not branch out.

5) All observations will be photographs uploaded to 2020 KHS HerpDRive iNaturalist project with locality data not obscured.

6) Dead-On-Road (DOR) specimens count if salvaged and brought back to camp to become scientific voucher specimens.

7) The geographic extent of the inaugural KHS Herp Race will be Kingman County.

8) You may receive points for up to 4 individuals of a species so long as they are observed at separate localities.

Specimens collected by such students must be placed in the possession of the permittee at the collection site, for housing of the specimen at the place(s) listed on the permit. The permittee or subpermittee (s) may not acquire specimens originating in the wild from other permission (including other holders of scientific, education, or exhibition wildlife permits), without permission from the Kansas Dept. of Wildlife & Parks.


