

UNDERSTANDING RATTLESNAKE BEHAVIOR: A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

M. Cale Morris holds a Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction and is the Venom Manager at the Phoenix Herpetological Sanctuary. As Venom Manager Cale is responsible for the PHS Antivenom Bank, cares for over 200 venomous snakes and lizards, and routinely teaches venomous snake handling classes. His research has focused on radio-telemetry and relocation of rattlesnakes in the extensive Phoenix metroplex, human interaction in bite behavior, and venom extraction. He has been a contributor to a number of published works focused on venomous snakes, as well as to media productions that include Animal Planet and National Geographic as well as more contemporary outreach in Buzz Feed News and Tik Tok. Cale has facilitated hundreds of venomous snake relocations and numerous training sessions in the safe handling and transport of venomous snakes.
